## UCalgary researchers at the Snyder Institute identify key inflammation pathway that causes acute kidney injury




Many people suffering from shock due to blood loss, severe infection like sepsis, those undergoing major surgery or having a kidney transplant are at risk of acute kidney injury (AKI). The debilitating condition affects up to seven per cent of all patients who are hospitalized — that adds up to more than 200,000 people in Canada at any given time.

AKI occurs in approximately 30 per cent of patients who undergo cardiac bypass

surgery, with about five per cent of patients requiring dialysis. Currently there are no specific therapies to prevent AKI.

A new study published in *Science Advances*, by a research team headed by Dr. Daniel Muruve, MD, and Dr. Justin Chun, MD, PhD, with the Cumming School of Medicine's (CSM) Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases, opens the door to the first potential therapy for AKI. Read more.

# New research by Snyder Institute investigators Drs. Laura Sycuro and Karen Lithgow and their study team uncovers promising therapeutic targets to prevent infection-induced preterm birth



Preterm birth affects 8% of pregnancies in Canada and is a leading cause of infant and child mortality worldwide. Although preterm births have many different causes, up to 60% of spontaneous preterm labour cases arise from bacterial infection in the uterus. In particular, the presence of bacteria associated with the common vaginal affliction bacterial vaginosis (BV) correlates with increased risk of preterm birth.

The ability of select BV bacteria to reach the uterus and infect pregnancy tissues has been linked to premature rupture of membranes, spontaneous abortion and preterm labour. However, understanding of how these bacteria affect the uterine environment and causally contribute to pregnancy complications is lacking. Read more.


#### Congrats to our members recently awarded CIHR Project Grants


