UCalgary/Snyder study points to potential new treatment for inflammatory bowel disease points to potential new treatment for inflammatory bowel disease



People with inflammatory bowel diseases develop inflammation of the intestine that can cause thickening of the gut wall and life-threatening blockage of the intestinal tube. Twenty to 50 per cent of people with Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis are affected over their lifetime by this poorly understood condition, called "fibrosis."

"Currently there are no approved treatments for this condition, beyond surgery, to remove the blocked section of intestine," says <u>Dr. Simon Hirota, PhD</u>, Canada Research Chair in Host-Microbe Interactions and Chronic Disease, and member of the Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases at the University of Calgary's Cumming School of Medicine.

A new study led by Hirota and published in the journal *Cellular and Molecular Gastroenterology and Hepatology* details a natural repair process in the human gut that opens the door to developing a potential treatment for fibrosis. The study involved researchers at the University of Calgary and the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York. <u>Read more.</u>

Canada Foundation for Innovation awards UCalgary close to \$10M for CL3 lab upgrade to study pathogens



The University of Calgary has been awarded a \$9.82-million Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) grant to upgrade the containment level three (CL3) lab where researchers will study SARS-CoV-2, tuberculosis and other pathogens, inside live animal models. The lab, one of only a few CL3 facilities in Canada, requires stringent containment equipment and protocols.

"We are very grateful to receive this funding. This is going to revolutionize what we can do," says <u>Dr. Paul Kubes, PhD</u>, member of the Snyder Institute for Chronic Diseases and professor in the Cumming School of Medicine. UCalgary's will be the only CL3 in North America with capacity to visualize pathogens inside the body and cells. <u>Read</u> <u>more.</u>
